The group was first established in 1985 by the National Communication Society and there are more than 500 different chapters that are active nationwide. Hope College is one of the first chapters in the country, earning the title of Alpha Delta chapter.

The name Lambda Pi Eta has a connected history with rhetoric and the Ancient Greek philosopher, Aristotle. LPH represents the three main components of persuasion: logos (Lambda), the logical appeal; pathos (Pi), the emotional appeal; and ethos (Eta), the ethical or credibility appeal. The honor society has six main goals:


- · Recognize, foster, and reward scholastic achievement through communication studies

Some Highlight Q&As

Q: What is the best advice you have received?

A: Don't ask for responsibility, assume responsibility. When you see a problem, go help...lead with "how can I help?", and the rest will come.

Q: How do public policy and government intersect?

A: Communicate and get people excited. Hope to get back to a political system in which we solve problems. Before we can fix our political system, we need to look at ourselves.

Q: What is a piece of scripture to use to motivate yourself?

A: Proverbs 16:9 - "In their hearts, humans plan their course, but the LORD establishes their steps." Humans plan but God determines. Trust in God's plan.

Q: Leadership's key component is empathy, how does that integrate into your life?

A: I am inspired by you. I am given hope that your generation has gone through something so major and has come out the other side without cynicism. We say the world is broken...so let's do something about it. I learned from you that the future is bright

Last Months Club: Fireside Chat with President Scogin

Last month, Comm Club had an awesome guest speaker, President Scogin, come to talk about his experience at Hope College as well as his thoughts on the importance of communication in all aspects of life.

Q: You've given many speeches, when you plan your speeches what is the creative process?

A: First, make a decision on if the speech requires presence or precision. If you require presence, then speak big ideas but remain present. (like chapel messages) If you're looking for precision (like State of the Institution speeches), be careful with words and I mostly speak from a script.

Q: Leadership with adversity, what is some advice when you are doubtful?

A: Be honest about your doubts. Think "I don't know how we will solve this, but I know that we can." Also learn critical voices because it can be helpful--but don't make it the loudest voice. Make God's voice the loudest. Believe that God made you to influence nations.


